Canal Dock Boathouse is a nonprofit committed to increasing equitable access to New Haven's waterfront. Our vision is to make the waterfront accessible to all residents of Greater New Haven, particularly people of color and those with low incomes.

Canal Dock takes a multigenerational approach to youth and family engagement by providing equitable access to people of all ages and ability levels, and all Canal Dock programming is accessible and free of charge for low and moderate income residents. Canal Dock conducts dry land fitness programs on our expansive, harborside platform, which allows residents to enjoy New Haven's waterfront. Community Boating Days are free to the community and allow novice boaters to participate in on-the-water activities that are accessible to all regardless of age or athletic ability. Participants can try rowing, yoga, kayaking, dragon boating, and sailing.

Our youth program, Crew Haven, is a holistic youth development program that addresses high school aged students' physical, educational, emotional, and social well-being through a rowing program that incorporates mentorship, leadership, and academic components. Crew Haven offers the opportunity to row and be part of a team as well as tutoring, and a mentorship program with Yale rowers.

PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

Crew Haven Youth Program:

In 2021, Canal Dock launched Crew Haven, a program designed to introduce high school youth to New Haven's waterways, promote equitable health/wellness activities through rowing and paddling, provide educational support for youth. Crew Haven is free for New Haven public and charter school students. There are currently 30 high school students from six different public schools in the Crew Haven Program. 77% of youth enrolled in Crew Haven are from underrepresented populations or reside in underserved neighborhoods.

Summer Youth Programing:

Canal Dock offers introductory and intermediate level rowing and paddling programs for youth ages 13-18. Camps are free for youth attending New Haven Public Schools.

Community Days

Community Days offer an opportunity for any resident to be introduced to the Canal Dock facility and various on-land and on-water boating activities for free. In 2022, 142 individuals participated in our free community boating days.

Canal Dock Membership:

Canal Dock offers affordable memberships to area residents. Members participate in boating activities and outdoor fitness classes. Many members become eager and willing volunteers, allowing Canal Dock to conduct a greater number of programs on New Haven's waterways.

Sailing Program:

Canal Dock is piloting a sailing program this year. Equitably priced membership and lessons will be offered and low income residents will be able to participate at no cost.
